Campus-based Awards (also called Institutional Scholarships and Grants)	Typically automatic with admission application. Some colleges require an additional 1-to 2-page form. If separate forms are required, submit them with admission application or as soon as possible. Local and Regional Scholarships	Separate applications for each - usually includes an essay, student résumé, transcripts, and letters of recommendation. TEACH Grant	Contact the financial aid office at the college where you will be enrolled to find out if they will participate in the TEACH Grant Program.	Contact the college where you will be enrolled. State Scholarships and Grants (also called Federal Robert C. Byrd Honors Scholarship Program)	U.S. Department of Education gives money to state education agencies to provide scholarships to graduating high school seniors. Each state education agency has its own application.	Contact each state for details regarding application requirements and deadlines. Varies – may be greater than \$10,000 in some states.
State of California (Cal Grants)	Submit FAFSA application and GPA Verification Form.	Submit FAFSA application using estimates as soon as possible after Jan. 1, 2013; submit GPA Verification form in mid-January 2013.	Students with the greatest financial need; must attend a California college or university.	Up to \$12,192/year for UC's, up to \$9,708/year for private colleges, and up to \$5,472 for Calif. State Univ.

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Federal Work Study	Automatic when FAFSA application is submitted. Additional forms are required prior to starting the Work Study job. Paid on hourly work rate for an on-campus or off-campus job.
National Scholarships	Request application from organization funding the scholarship - usually includes an essay, student résumé, transcripts, letters of recommendation. Check Fastweb.com listings.	As required – anytime from Fall 2012 through Spring 2013.	Generally, all students - scholarships typically awarded based on quality of essay, community service, and academic achievements. Students may have to demonstrate financial need.	Varies from a few \$100's up to several \$1,000's.
ROTC Scholarships (Reserve Officer Training Corps)	Complete online applications, send SAT or ACT scores directly to ROTC scholarship programs, and apply to at least 3 ROTC affiliated colleges.	Apply to at least 3 ROTC affiliated colleges by Nov. 1, 2012 (date recommended by military). Complete online ROTC scholarship application by: <u>Air Force</u> – Dec. 1, 2012 <u>Army</u> – January 10, 2013 <u>Navy</u> – January 20, 2013	Generally, all students - scholarships are based solely on merit in exchange for years of military service with the Army, Air Force, Navy, or Marine Corps after graduation.	Up to full-ride scholarship.
